Our subject for the next 15 weeks will be the New Testament.

The word “testament” means “agreement” or “covenant.” So the New Testament is the “new agreement” God made with man through Jesus Christ.

My purpose will be to help you gain an overall knowledge of the contents of the 27 books of the New Testament. We will spend time with the historical settings, the characteristics and teachings as well as the applications of these wondrous books.

We will identify together important places associated with the background of the New Testament, the life of Jesus and the beginning and expansion of Christ’s church.

Through many, many years - going back to 1971, I have had the privilege of visiting over and over again so many places we will study together, Israel, Jordan, Lebanon, Syria, Egypt, Cypress, Turkey (Asia Minor in Scriptures), Patmos, Crete, Greece, Rome and the Baltics. These sojourns have made the scriptures burst into living color on the plasma screen of my mind. I hope to impart those insights to you during these weeks.
